① それをいただきます。



I'll get it.

If you say this to a shop clerk when you want to buy the item he or she is showing you, it will probably sound odd to the clerk, because, strictly speaking, "I'll get it" means that you're going to get something and bring it to him or her!

"Take" is the correct verb in this situation ——— and don't worry, he or she won't think you want to steal it!



I'll take it.



② 彼がダンスをします。



He will play dance.

This mistake is more common among our school students, but sometimes adults make it, too. You might have learned that 「する」 is "play" in English when we're talking about physical activities. That's true if we're talking about a game, like baseball or soccer. However, "dance" is not a game; on the other hand, it is a verb! So 「ダンスをする」 is simply "dance" in English.



He will dance.
