Let's play trump!

In English, "trump" is not the name of a game. The word refers to the suit (hearts, diamonds, clubs or spades) that is strongest in certain card games, or 「切り札」. (Of course, "Trump" can also be a family name — including that of a current U.S. president!)

These traditional cards are simply called "playing cards," and we use them to "play card games," or simply "play cards."
